WELCOME TO MASS: Christ is risen! Alleluia! 'Truth? What is that?', asked FUNERAL MASSES Might weekday regulars come to Funeral Masses to Pilate during the trial of Jesus. In today's gospel, Christ—who calls Himself the truth-prays that we may be kept true to the Father's name. He asks that we may be consecrated in the truth. He does this because He is sending us out to bear witness in the world to God's truth. The truth is not always welcomed—look at the trial of Jesus—but the truth is true whether everyone or no one believes it. In this age of 'relative truth' absolutes are often rejected. Yet it is the Holy Spirit, leading us into all truth, that empowers the apostles and us to witness to the truth. As Gerard Manley Hopkins beautifully translated Aquinas' beautiful hymn to the Blessed Sacrament 'Truth Himself speaks truly, or there's nothing true'. (hymn 660 in Laudate). God bless you all, Fr Stephen


